NEARBY ATTRACTIONS:

Skiing/snowboarding

Rated #1 ski resort in North America by TransWorld Magazine, 2004, Mammoth offers over 3,500 skiable acres and 3,100 vertical feet. Mammoth has over 300 sunny days a year with an average snowfall of 400 inches.

Golf

Located just ½ mile from the hotel is Sierra Star, an 18-hole championship golf course, with breathtaking views of the Sierra'. With an elevation of 8,000 feet Sierra Star is the highest course in CA. Also in the area is the Snow Creek Golf Course (9-hole) and Driving Range.

Fishing

The Owens River, San Joaquin River and Mammoth Lakes Basin are favorite spots to fish for the world famous Alpers Trout and many others. Wilderness Outfitters, located inside McCoy Sports in the Village, is Mammoth's fly-fishing headquarters and only full-line Orvis shop.

Yosemite National Park – Just 30 miles from Mammoth

Highway 395 runs north and south along the Eastern Sierra Mountain range, with Mammoth at its heart. From Mammoth you'll have central access to Yosemite National Park, Ansel Adams Wilderness, Devil's Postpile Monument, Red's Meadows and much more.

Hiking

Miles and miles of well-maintained trails converge on Mammoth and lead you through pine tree corridors and mountain lakes - all with enchanting vistas of the Sierra Mountain range. Whether you're taking it easy, looking for family fun or all out adventure seeking – there's a trail for everyone.

Mountain Biking

Mammoth's bike park is California's largest offering over 85 miles of single-track trail. The Scenic Gondola offers uphill access to the summit with expansive views of the Eastern Sierra's; then zigzag down to the lower trails through pine tree corridors.

Rock Climbing

Located at Main Lodge is the Adventure Center featuring a 15 foot climbing wall and zip-line. If you're looking for more adventure, the local area boasts world-class climbing for all levels of climbers.

Scenic Gondola rides

A world of discovery at 11,053 feet! The scenic Panorama Gondola offers breathtaking views of the Minarets, Mono Lake and 400 miles of Eastern Sierra Peaks that average 12,000 feet in elevation.
